What makes a good persuasive paragraph?

- A good persuasive paragraph must have an opinion, reasons and details/evidence connected to the reasons given.
- Easy to understand.
- Flow.
- Sentence variety.
- The paragraph has to be believable and convincing.
- The evidence needs to be verifiable.

What makes a good expository paragraph?

- Easy to understand.
- Flow
- It must be specific and detailed.
- Minimize grammatical errors.
